# NEW ENGLAND INNS

## September 19—Sunday

Check in to the Litchfield Inn in Litchfield, CT with authentic Colonial décor that bespeaks both elegance and warmth. A hearty New England dinner is included tonight at the inn.

## September 20—Monday

After a deluxe Continental breakfast (included), meet your guide and tour the quaint Berkshire region. See wonderful mountain vistas and charming New England villages and hear about the gilded age of this mountainous resort area. ## September 21—Tuesday

Then visit Hemmings Car Lover's Oasis to step back in time to see a vintage auto collection and automobile memorabilia. Lunch is included at the Dorset Inn with an historic presentation. The Dorset was voted "one of America's best restaurants" by Wine Spectacular. Built in 1796, it is Vermont's oldest operating inn. A visit to Hidene Estate and Gardens follows with a tour of the Lincoln family descendants' home, a 24-room Georgian Revival mansion with gorgeous gardens and a 1,000 piece Aeolian organ played for you.

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### September 22—Wednesday

Enjoy a full breakfast at the hotel before visiting Adams Farm, a multi-generational Vermont farm including a narrated hayride through the maple grove with an agricultural demonstration and farm fresh treat. Stop for a photo op at Hogback Lookout, a 180° mountain vista, breathtaking at any season! Then visit the Yankee Candle Company featuring the Bavarian Christmas Village, Old World Shops, the Nordic Fountain, the Oompah Boys, a candle-making museum and more. Next, visit the Springfield Armory Museum, a National Historic Site housing the largest collections of US military arms in the country. Learn about the history of military weapons and the industry. See Jefferson Davis' rifle, a Texas Ranger Cold Walker, Longfellow's "organ of muskets" and more. Then check into the Publick House Historic Inn in Sturbridge, MA for the next two nights and enjoy the comfort and Yankee hospitality as our early ancestors did at this 1771 inn. Learn all about the Publick House Inn's vivid history and famous visits while enjoying tea and a tasty treat. An unforgettable dinner is included tonight at the inn.

### September 23—Thursday

Enjoy a deluxe Continental breakfast (included) before visiting Old Sturbridge Village with costumed townsmen, homes, meeting houses and craft shops. Cross the covered bridge and explore the water powered mills and working farm. Then take a guided tour of Quabbin Reservoir, a majestic pristine protected area for wildlife, which is the result of flooding four towns creating Boston's drinking water. Dinner tonight will be at the Salem Cross Inn, a 1707 inn scenically located on 600 acres of rolling countryside. Musical entertainment follows an exquisite dinner.

### September 24—Friday
