## VOLUNTEER GUIDELINES:

- ◆ Volunteers do not provide transportation for clients
- ◆ All volunteer services are provided at no cost to the client
- ◆ Volunteers must not give out their home numbers to clients
- ◆ Volunteers may be reimbursed for mileage
- ◆ Monthly meetings will be held to keep volunteers abreast of service and opportunities offered by the agency, as well as other services available in the community.
