



The following transportation services are available to Burlington County residents 60 years of age or older. Disabled residents under 60 must complete the SEN-HAN Disabled Rider Application. These are available on our website—www.scucs.org—or by contacting our office.

Service is available in Burlington County and up to five miles over the County's borders. Service is provided on a door to door basis.

NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL

These are defined as rides to medical appointments at a physician's office, medical facility or hospital. Reservations can be made **two days to two weeks** in advance.

PERSONAL BUSINESS

Transportation for personal business such as home/hospital visits, banking, entitlement offices, social events, etc. is available within five (5) miles of your home. Reservations can be made **three days** in advance.

EMPLOYMENT

Seniors and disabled residents can request private employment transportation Monday through Friday.
